

Curriculum (CP= College Prep, H= Honors, AP = Advanced Placement)

PJP's Theology courses include: Eighth Grade Theology, Theology I, Theology II, Theology III, Theology IV, and Theology IV/Campus Ministries.

PJP is an Archdiocesan co-educational high school. Serving the community of St. Tammany Parish and the surrounding area, PJP provides a Catholic, academic setting for about 340 young men and women through a Standards Based Educational Curriculum, infused with Christian values.

A school dedicated to the 3 pillars of its mission: *Academic Excellence, Faith Development* and *Leadership*, the young men and women of Pope John Paul II are challenged to excel, while growing in self-confidence, self-worth and thoughtful inquiry.

Faculty

There are 33 professional faculty members, half of whom possess advanced degrees. The average faculty teaching experience is 15 years. The current student/teacher ratio is 11:1 with an average class size of 21 students per classroom.

Accreditation

Pope John Paul II Catholic High School is accredited by Advanc-Ed/SACS-CASI, most recently receiving re-accreditation in 2018, and is approved by the Louisiana Board of Elementary and Secondary Education.

College Readiness / Testing

As a college preparatory school, students take and prepare for a variety of standardized tests, most of which are administered on campus. PJP administers the ASPIRE to eighth graders, freshmen and sophomores, and some juniors participate in the PSAT/NMSQT. The ACT is offered to students four times a year at Pope John Paul II. Students are also prepared for the SAT and SAT II and Advanced Placement tests, through classroom instruction.

ACT Information

At 22.8, our students have consistently scored above all local, state, regional and national averages on the American College Test.

Extracurricular Activities

Pope John Paul II Catholic High School is proud to say that it offers its students a wide array of extracurricular sports and clubs to satisfy all the interests of its students.

PJP's sports include: boys' football, girls' volleyball, boys' and girls' swimming, boys' and girls' cross country, cheerleading, dance team, boys' and girls' power lifting, boys' and girls' soccer, boys' and girls' basketball, boys' and girls' track and field, boys' and girls' golf, boys' and girls' tennis, girls' softball, and boys' baseball.

Service Hour Program

Students at PJP participate yearly in this curriculum-driven program. Beginning in eighth grade year, all students are responsible for serving the following hours each academic year, at least half of which must be performed in a church parish setting:

In an average school year, PJP students complete over 9,500 hours of service to local churches and the community.

Grading System / Class Ranking

Grades achieved in all credit courses are counted for rank in class.

Technology

At PJP, technology contributes to academic excellence across the curriculum, to the safety of our students and to effective communication with families. Each student is required to have an Apple iPad4, featuring note taking software and wireless access to on-line resources and textbooks. The iPads allow us to expand our course offerings to include a wide variety of virtual electives and dual enrollment electives. Our school is equipped with video surveillance throughout the campus for the safety of all. Each parent and student receives his/her own website passcode for monitoring grades. Additionally all teachers use Google Classroom for posting assignments. Through our administrative software, PJP is able to contact all families about upcoming activities and especially about any emergency situations via telephones and email accounts.
